New Testament Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5.1-11

Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anything written to you. For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. When they say, 'There is peace and security', then sudden destruction will come upon them, as labour pains come upon a pregnant woman, and there will be no escape! But you, beloved, are not in darkness, for that day to surprise you like a thief; for you are all children of light and children of the day; we are not of the night or of darkness. So then, let us not fall asleep as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober; for those who sleep sleep at night, and those who are drunk get drunk at night. But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, and put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. For God has destined us not for wrath but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live with him. Gospel Reading

New Lockdown

Communal worship is not currently permitted during the new lockdown, but we will continue to broadcast audio services on Radio Cherwell and our parish website, and our church building will remain open for private prayer and for funeral services. We are asked to devote these four weeks to prayer, joining together in prayer at 6pm every day – resources are on the Church of England website and will be shared round our parish WhatsApp group. If you can, please light a candle in your window at 6pm daily as a sign of Christ's light shining in the darkness.

Building Project News

On Wednesday 4th November, Oxford City Council approved our planning application for the church extension, a resubmission of the original plans approved in 2016. At the meeting, council members spoke positively about the sensitive design of the extension, and about supporting our clear need for better facilities and accessibility. Jennifer Carpenter spoke against the plans on behalf of the Holy Trinity Preservation Group, and concerns were raised about the need to protect existing graves and the possibility of unmarked graves underneath the new extension. Laura assured the committee that we will deal sensitively with these concerns, which are also addressed in the faculty permission, and asks you to continue to pray for the project as we move forwards positively and peacefully.

The PCC are now discussing a proposal to phase the building project, which means that the interior lighting work and other electrical rewiring would take place first, before the extension and other reordering work. The proposed new lighting design from Light Perceptions Ltd can be viewed on the church website.

We cannot leave approved minutes of meetings at the back of church any more, but anyone on the electoral roll is welcome to view minutes that have been approved and deemed non-confidential, and can request these electronically from the PCC secretary (felicity.hthq@gmail.com) or in paper copy from the parish office.
