The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you and also with you.

We are busy working on plans to mark Advent and Christmas, and will announce more details on Advent Sunday, 29th November. We will hold two online services to mark Advent Sunday: an Advent Carol Service and a Eucharist. Advent is a time of prayerful preparation for the coming of Our Lord, and in due course we will share further resources to aid us in our Advent devotions.

Building Project News

On Wednesday 4th November, Oxford City Council approved our planning application for the church extension, a resubmission of the original plans approved in 2016. At the meeting, council members spoke positively about the sensitive design of the extension, and about supporting our clear need for better facilities and accessibility. Jennifer Carpenter spoke against the plans on behalf of the Holy Trinity Preservation Group, and concerns were raised about the need to protect existing graves and the possibility of unmarked graves underneath the new extension. Laura assured the committee that we will deal sensitively with these concerns, which are also addressed in the faculty permission, and asks you to continue to pray for the project as we move forwards positively and peacefully.

The PCC are now discussing a proposal to phase the building project, which means that the interior lighting work and other electrical rewiring would take place first, before the extension and other reordering work. The proposed new lighting design from Light Perceptions Ltd can be viewed on the church website.

PCC Meeting

The PCC will meet on Wednesday 25th November at 7.30pm via Zoom. We cannot leave approved minutes of meetings at the back of church any more, but anyone on the electoral roll is welcome to view minutes that have been approved and deemed non-confidential, and can request these electronically from the PCC secretary (felicity.hthq@gmail.com) or in paper copy from the parish office.

We are currently exploring whether it would be possible to do some outdoor carol singing at set locations around the parish, in collaboration with other churches. A lot depends on the Covid-19 guidance that will be in place at the time, but we have provisionally set at date of **Monday 21st December at 5pm**. More information to follow!

Group members will be asked to pray for one another, and also to provide practical support to one another if necessary.
