Introduction

Today we are celebrating Climate Sunday – but what actually is Climate Sunday and why are we celebrating it?

The last year has given many of us a chance to spend more time appreciating nature in our local area. You may have reflected on the richness of Creation, both here and throughout the world, and our place in it. But we are also aware that human beings are changing Creation in many ways, not least by warming the climate. Global warming is already apparent, and we are seeing the effects of that in more droughts, floods and other extreme weather events. Science tells us this will get a lot worse if warming is allowed to continue much more, eventually to the extent of making large parts of our planet uninhabitable.

As Christians we believe that Creation is God's work, and by harming Creation we are going against God's will. We are also called to love our neighbour, and it is our poorest neighbours – in our own community, in our country and globally – who tend to be hardest hit by the problems arising from climate change. So working to limit climate change as much as we can is part of our mission as Christians in the 21st century.

That is why the Eco Church group in Holy Trinity suggested we hold this Climate Sunday service. We are not alone – Climate Sunday is an initiative of Churches Together in Britain and Ireland, and hundreds of churches of different denominations up and down the country are holding their own Climate Sunday services and events during 2021.

We are doing this now, because in November this year, the world's leaders are meeting in Glasgow for the latest United Nations climate change summit – known as COP26. Our own government is chairing these talks, and that gives us in the UK a unique opportunity to influence the outcome. One way we can all do that, recommended by the Climate Sunday organisers, is to sign the Climate Coalition's declaration called 'The Time Is Now', which encourages our government to lead the world by ensuring our recovery gets us on track to net-zero emissions ahead of the Glasgow talks.
