Church Capacity and Communion Distribution

We have reviewed our Covid-19 risk assessments recently, and made some changes to the distribution of communion on both Sundays and Wednesdays, in a way that allows us to increase our capacity whilst keeping social distancing. The main changes are:

- We will no longer use tongs to distribute communion: the priest will 'drop' the wafer into the communicant's hands instead.
- On Sundays, we have established a one-way system with a moving queue, for people to come forwards to receive communion. Anyone with mobility problems is welcome to remain in their place and the priest will come to them as before.
- On Wednesdays, we will position seating to enable communicants to stand at the central or north aisle, and the priest will bring communion to them there.
- Extra hand sanitizer will be available.
