The Liturgy of the Word

Gospel Reading

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. Glory to you, O Lord.

Gospel reading: Luke 8. 26-39

Then they arrived at the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. As he stepped out on land, a man of the city who had demons met him. For a long time he had worn no clothes, and he did not live in a house but in the tombs. When he saw Jesus, he fell down before him and shouted at the top of his voice, 'What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, do not torment me'— for Jesus had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many times it had seized him; he was kept under guard and bound with chains and shackles, but he would break the bonds and be driven by the demon into the wilds.) Jesus then asked him, 'What is your name?' He said, 'Legion'; for many demons had entered him. They begged him not to order them to go back into the abyss.

Now there on the hillside a large herd of swine was feeding; and the demons begged Jesus to let them enter these. So he gave them permission. Then the demons came out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and was drowned.

When the swineherds saw what had happened, they ran off and told it in the city and in the country. Then people came out to see what had happened, and when they came to Jesus, they found the man from whom the demons had gone sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid. Those who had seen it told them how the one who had been possessed by demons had been healed. Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Gerasenes asked Jesus to leave them; for they were seized with great fear. So he got into the boat and returned. The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with him; but Jesus sent him away, saying, 'Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you.' So he went away, proclaiming throughout the city how much Jesus had done for him.


As our saviour taught us, so we pray

If you wish to receive the chalice, please hold the base of the chalice and guide it towards your lips – the person administering the chalice will not let go of it in the process. Please note that there is no obligation to take the chalice and it is fine still to receive communion in one kind only (the bread). If you do not wish to receive communion and would prefer a blessing instead, please do come forwards as well.

Over the 20 plus years we have been organising the fete it has become clear that some things work better than others. In recent

times one of our biggest problems is what to do with the 'stuff' that remains after the event which means trips to the tip and charity shops, but most of it ends up going to landfill. We get some truly amazing items, but we also get things that should never been sent in the first place.

We thought it would be helpful to give a perspective on the environmental impact of running the fete. We all want to do our bit for the environment so here's a few things to think about when getting items together. The main problem areas are both Toys and White Elephant, which probably provide about 80% of the stuff left over.

Things to think about when sorting out donations

Only send items that are clean/working and in saleable condition - think, would I buy it?

No electricals (by law we can't sell them)

New/unused candles/toiletries - no half-used items, please, they just go straight in the bin.

Food stuffs – check they are in date.

This will be our first Summer Fete in three years and we really look forward to seeing you on the day and helping if you can. Please put the date in your diaries and come along!
