The Liturgy of Baptism

Presentation of Enid for Baptism

Enid is introduced to the congregation
The minister addresses the whole congregation:

Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me. Do not stop them'. We thank God for Enid who has come to be baptised today. Christ loves her and welcomes her into his Church. So I ask you all:

Will you support Enid as she begins his journey of faith? **We will.**

Will you help her to live and grow within God's family? **We will.**

The minister then addresses the parents and godparents

God knows each of us by name and we are his. Parents and godparents, you speak for Enid today. Will you pray for her, and help her to follow Christ? **We will.**

The Decision

The minister addresses Enid through her parents and godparents

We all wander far from God and lose our way: Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home. In baptism we respond to his call. Therefore I ask:

Do you turn away from sin? **I do.**

Do you reject evil?

I do.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? **I do.**

Do you trust in him as Lord? **I do.**

Signing with the Cross

The minister makes the sign of the cross on Enid's forehead

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.

Do not be ashamed of Christ.
You are his for ever.
Stand bravely with him
against all the powers of evil,
and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen.**

Prayer over the Water

The baptism party gathers at the font. Please stand and turn to face the font.

Praise God who made heaven and earth, who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

We praise you, loving Father, for the gift of your Son Jesus. He was baptised in the River Jordan, where your Spirit came upon him and revealed him as the Son you love. He sent his followers to baptise all who turn to him. Now, Father, we ask you to bless this water, that those who are baptised in it may be cleansed in the water of life, and, filled with your Spirit, may know that they are loved as your children, safe in Christ for ever.

Profession of Faith

Let us affirm our common faith in Jesus Christ.

We believe in God the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named.

We believe in God the Son, who lives in our hearts through faith, and fills us with his love.

We believe in God the Holy Spirit, who strengthens us with power from on high.

We believe in one God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

Baptism

Enid, I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**



Please do not dip your wafer into the chalice. Please note that there is no obligation to take the chalice and it is fine still to receive communion in one kind only (the bread). If you do not wish to receive communion and would prefer a blessing instead, please do come forwards as well.
