As our gifts of bread and wine are offered:

Priest:	At this table all share the cup of pain and
	celebration.
All	Thanks be to God

Blessing the gifts of the people

May the Lord bless these gifts and all gifts given to the church that they may be used to bring new hope to the downtrodden and new life to all who wait upon your word. **Amen.**

Eucharistic Prayer

Jesus is here! His Spirit is with us. Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord. It is right to give thanks and praise.

Reader: Why is it right to give thanks and praise? *Deacon*: Let's listen, and we will hear.

Lord of all life, you created the universe, where all living things reflect your glory. You give us this great and beautiful earth, to discover and to cherish.

Reader: You give us sun and moon and star-lit sky, everything that gives us light.

Reader: You give us the fish in the sea, the birds of the air, and every plant and tree.

Reader: You give us friends and families busy streets for young and old.

Reader: You give us your love, even when things go wrong.

Reader: You give us happy times and things to celebrate.

In these we taste your kingdom, a feast for all your children. You made us all, each wonderfully different, to join with the angels and to praise you:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest. We thank you, loving Father, because, when we turned away, you sent Jesus, your Son. He gave his life for us on the cross and shows us the way to live. Send your Holy Spirit that these gifts of bread and wine may be for us Christ's body and his blood.

Reader: Why do we share this bread and wine? *Deacon*: Let's listen, and we will hear.

On the night before he died, when darkness had fallen, Jesus took bread. He gave thanks, broke it, and shared it with his disciples, saying: 'This is my body, given for you. Do this to remember me.'

(The bread is raised. Bells are rung)

After they had eaten, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and shared it with his disciples, saying: 'This is my blood, poured out for you and for many, for the forgiveness of sins.'

(The wine is raised. Bells are rung)

So Father, with this bread and this cup we celebrate his love, his death, his risen life. As you feed us with these gifts, send your Holy Spirit, and change us more and more to be like Jesus our Saviour. *Reader:* How do we follow Jesus Christ? *Deacon:* Let's listen, and we will hear.

Help us, Father, to love one another, as we look forward to that day when suffering is ended, and all creation is gathered in your loving arms. And now with all your saints we give you glory, through Jesus Christ, in the strength of the Spirit, today and for ever. Amen.

We sit or kneel for a period of silence.

The Lord's Prayer


Let us pray together the prayer that Jesus taught us:
