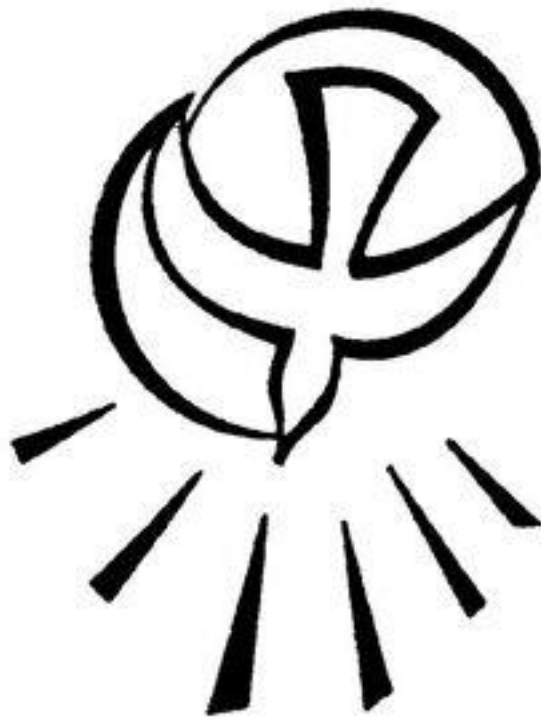

Candidate Testimonies

Richard Churchill

My journey towards God has taken a long and difficult path. Growing up I was never encouraged to seek a relationship with God, and through circumstances at the time found it hard to trust and believe in a loving God who could allow the events that happened to take place. Despite this I still found myself having a rather tenuous faith that God is watching over me. It was not until my time as an undergraduate studying PPP that I found my faith strengthen. It was through philosophy I was able to accept, and understand, a little more of God's nature, and even though bad things do happen they do so for a reason. To test us and shape us into the people we will become. It is through our suffering that we are able to develop empathy and patience, the tools to carry out God's mission on Earth. I am getting baptized and confirmed today, as I am ready to take that step towards using the skills God has helped me develop to carry out his work to help others who have had to share similar misfortunes.

Rikky Rooksby

My spiritual life has been often guided by the power of music and the insights of women. It began unconsciously with school hymns by Vaughan Williams, and early exposure at home to his *Sinfonia Antartica* which confirmed this child's tendency to see life as a thoroughly Serious Business.

Aged 12 I met a girl three years older who told me she was a Christian, just as George Harrison's 'My Sweet Lord' topped the charts. The combination was potent. Desperate to win her affection I

decided some divine assistance was needed. Thus it was that the local Baptist minister found a young boy knocking on his door one suburban evening wanting to talk about God! A few months of Sunday School followed, but the girl was destined for someone else, and I stopped going. Then a rock musician appeared who ignited a desire to be active in music. The consequences of this encounter helped create a working life as a guitar teacher and author, even to this day. His instinctive late-1960s belief in the spiritual sustained my teenage self with enough enchantment until further experiences showed this dimension to life was one I would have to explore. From then on it was always present in some manifestation.

Over decades I learned that growth comes in many forms, and came to see people as spiritual beings on a human journey. A female friend suggested I try Quaker Meeting, since I was by then familiar with contemplative techniques. There, almost thirty years ago, I was blessed to meet my wife Rhonda. Though I have remained a Quaker 'attender', in recent years my focus has been toward an engagement with the mystery of faith and a theology of relationship. That I now know something of the grace of ritual worship in a loved place owes much to the ministry of Laura Biron-Scott and Rob Gilbert at Holy Trinity. During the pandemic this contact has helped nurture two symphonies. For all this, I am most grateful.

Presentation of the Candidates

*Please remain seated as the candidates are presented by the vicar
The bishop asks the candidates*

Do you wish to be baptized?

Are you ready with your own mouth and from your own heart to

The bishop addresses the candidates

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light.
To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with
him. Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?

I reject them.

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?

I renounce them.

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ?

I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

I submit to Christ as Lord.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

I come to Christ.

May God, who has given you the desire to follow Christ, give you also strength to continue in the Way.

All **Amen.**

Signing with the Cross

The vicar makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of each candidate for baptism, saying

Christ claims you for his own.
Receive the sign of his cross.

When all the candidates for baptism have been signed, the bishop says to them

Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.
All **Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ
against sin, the world and the devil,
and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.**

The bishop says

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness,
restore in you the image of his glory,
and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

All **Amen.**

Please stand as the ministers and candidates gather at the baptismal font.

Prayer Over the Water

The bishop says

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give thanks and praise.

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water
to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life.
Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation.
Through water you led the children of Israel
from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the promised land.
In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John
and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ,
to lead us from the death of sin to newness of life.
We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism.
In it we are buried with Christ in his death.
By it we share in his resurrection.
Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.
Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son,
we baptize into his fellowship those who come to him in faith.
Now sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit,
they may be cleansed from sin and born again.
Renewed in your image, may they walk by the light of faith
and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord;
to whom with you and the Holy Spirit
be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

All **Amen.**

Profession of Faith

The bishop addresses the congregation

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess together with these candidates the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Baptism

The bishop asks: Richard, Charlotte, Rikky

Is this your faith?

This is my faith.

Richard, Charlotte, Rikky

I baptize you
in the name of the Father,

When all have been baptized, the bishop says

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church,
pour upon you the riches of his grace,

Please sit as the bishop, candidates and their sponsors gather at the place of confirmation, and we sing a hymn.

The bishop stands before those who are to be confirmed, and says

Our help is in the name of the Lord
All **who has made heaven and earth.**

Blessed be the name of the Lord
All **now and for ever. Amen.**

The bishop extends his hands towards those to be confirmed and prays:

Almighty and ever-living God,
you have given these your servants new birth
in baptism by water and the Spirit,
and have forgiven them all their sins.
Let your Holy Spirit rest upon them:
the Spirit of wisdom and understanding;
the Spirit of counsel and inward strength;
the Spirit of knowledge and true godliness;
and let their delight be in the fear of the Lord.

All **Amen.**

The bishop addresses each candidate by name and anoints them on the forehead with the oil of chrism.

N, God has called you by name and made you his own.

The bishop then lays his hand on the head of each, saying

Confirm, O Lord, your servant with your Holy Spirit.
All **Amen.**

The bishop invites the congregation to pray for the candidates:

**Defend, O Lord, these your servants
with your heavenly grace,
that they may continue yours for ever,
and daily increase in your Holy Spirit more and more
until they come to your everlasting kingdom.
Amen.**

The Peace

Please stand as the bishop introduces the Peace.

God has made us one in Christ.
He has set his seal upon us
and, as a pledge of what is to come,
has given the Spirit to dwell in our hearts.

The peace of the Lord be always with you
and also with you.

The congregation greet the newly confirmed with a round of applause! We exchange a sign of peace.


